

PRIMARY SCHOOL PE AND SPORT FUNDING

The PE and Sport Allocation is funding provided to schools in addition to main school funding. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on the provision of PE and sport in schools.

The government provided additional funding for the last three academic years to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. The funding is to be continued in 2016 to 2017.

Schools are able to decide how the PE and Sport funding is spent, ensuring that additional provision enhances the provision for PE in school. The Headteacher and Governing Body are held accountable for how they have used the additional funding.

The table below shows how the funding is planned to be spent 2016-2017. The impact of this funding will be displayed at the end of the year.
