The easiest to grow is cress but maybe be more adventurous.</p>	<p><b>Task 4</b></p> <p>Practice counting in 2s, 5s and 10s as often as you can. You could use socks to help you with your 2s, handprints to help you with your 5s and 2 footprints to help you with your 10s.</p>
<p><b>Task 5</b></p> <p>Go on a walk and see how many different plants and flowers you can find. Take a photo or, if possible, collect them and make a collage.</p>	<p><b>Task 6</b></p> <p>Write a letter to your new teacher to tell them all about yourself. You could include questions you want to know and information about yourself.</p>	<p><b>Task 7</b></p> <p>Have a film night with your family and then write a film review on your chosen film. You need to include information about the plot, characters and setting as well as give it an overall rating.</p>	<p><b>Task 8</b></p> <p>Design a new front cover for one of your favourite books. Try to add lots of colour and make it look exciting.</p>
	<p><b>Task 9</b></p> <p>Practice telling the time with 'o' clock. Make a clock using a paper plate or a circle of cardboard and play <i>What's the Time Mr Wolf?</i> with your grownups.</p>	<p><b>Task 10</b></p> <p>Make a map of your journey to school. Try and include any points of interest that you see on the way. You could make it look like a treasure map with tea.</p>
